<p><b>Sports Building Team-work</b> Students will enjoy, and understand sports, and the rules of the game; while building team-work, as well as learn how to be productive on and off the field. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Making Music! My Way</b> Students will have a great time exploring what exactly makes music, and what found objects such as . . . (trash-cans, pots and pans, and traditional instruments played in unconventional ways can sound like. By the end of the camp, students will learn what it takes to compose a sound tone poem or song. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Dance Get up! Get Moving!</b> <i>Get up, and get moving! Students will learn basic Broadway dance terms and steps in tap, jazz, and ballet; develop acting skills as they apply to song and dance; improve movement coordination, physical fitness, and self-confidence; also, learn the importance of teamwork, as they perform dance excerpts from well-known Broadway shows.</i> (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Music Drum Circle!</b> Students will perform many types of percussion instruments in a drum circle ensemble. You don't need to know how to read music. Rhythm is FUN-damental! So everyone can play. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Computer Skills Web Page Design</b> Explore the Internet in an entirely new way! Students will learn the basics of making a fully interactive web page, finding and editing images, as well as using the Internet safely. Students will also learn what design elements will make an appealing web page. Using designing/editing software each student will create a final web page of his or her own design. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Sewing! Can I make It For You?</b> Teaching children how to sew can be so much fun! They will learn hand embroidery, cross-stitching, how to use a sewing machine safely, how to read a pattern, how to lay out a pattern, how to cut efficiently. Projects will include doll clothes, pillow cases, laundry bags, potholders, aprons, curtains, scrunches, scarves, pillows, mini-quilts; and making their own clothes too! (2-Hours)</p>	<p><b>Writing Skills: Becoming an Author</b> Do you love mysteries, comedies, historical fictions, or non-fiction? How would you like to become an author? Express your artistic side to illustrate a children's book, include pictures; and quotes in (Your chapter of the book). You will publish the book to be donated to a local daycare. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Math For The Fun of It!</b> Teaching traditional math generally focuses on the memorization, and application of procedures, our summer Math Enrichment Program helps students develop advanced problem-solving skills, in an interactive fun way; full with fun games, stories and puzzles. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>College Life!</b> Exploration of college campus environment is perfect for students entering middle and high school, who have started to visualize themselves as a college student, and those who have never visualized themselves as a college student, but can benefit from doing so. You will study the campus physical environment, and by using a local College campus; write an essay putting yourself into the campus life (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>The Old Games Played</b> Thousands of years ago there were no television sets, cell phones, or video games, but there were always enough people around for a game to play. Explore the history; the old games back in the day, and play some of the games our grandparents use to play. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Majorette: Step High and Proud!</b> Baton twirling requires coordination, and control of the body; additionally, it requires a great amount of flexibility in order to properly execute baton, dance, and gymnastics elements. The students will develop team-work as well as build self-esteem and confidence. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Social Skills: Solve It Yourself!</b> Students will learn how to get along with others, use self-control, accept differences, resolve conflicts peacefully, and make healthy choices. This class will also, cover (BULLYING) and the distresses, of a person who is being bullied; and finally we will cover the consequences. Bullying can happen anywhere, and to anyone. Jr., Nelson Mandela, Abraham Lincoln, Bill Gates; to name a few of our great leaders. This class will culminate with a service-learning project in our own community; by learning about various people who has made a difference. (2-Hour)</p> <p><b>Reading Is Fun-damental!</b> Numerous studies have shown that the loss of learning over the summer months can be detrimental to a students' education. Most studies maintain a difference of two years between, students who read over the summer; compared to those who do not. Providing students with the opportunity to read over the summer, allows a fun way for students of all ages to combat this learning difference. Our Summer Reading Program offers the following benefits: • Students discover the joy of reading • Students practice reading, writing, speaking skills • Students experience challenging enrichment to prepare them for the upcoming school year • Students choose from a variety of interactive activities related to their reading • Students interact with text by conversing with parents who read along with them. Students will play melodies in several positions and participate in group playing. Students will develop good practice habits, and discover the composers, and the history behind music. (2-Hours)</p>	<p><b>Music: Learning to Appreciate All Music</b> Explore the different kinds of music from around the world, particularly those not evident in popular Western music. We will compare and contrast familiar and unfamiliar types of music and practice expressing thoughts about music. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Spanish</b> Students will learn greetings &amp; introductions, the alphabet, numbers, clothing, how you are feeling, and talking about your favorite activities, all in Spanish; use Spanish, while you are. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Etiquette Skills Feel Comfortable</b> Do you ever feel awkward and uncomfortable when communicating with family, classmates, and various settings? If so, don't worry! Lots of people feel that way. Take control of your life and learn some basic etiquette tips to help you feel more poised and graceful. (1-Hour)</p> <p><b>Be A Model!</b> Fashion modeling involves using people to show off a particular type of fashion. This allows the public to see how a particular fashion looks, when worn; which can help create public interest in purchasing the item. Models are often needed for: apparels, accessories, jewelry, hosting events, fund-raising; and trade shows.
